All animals must rest, but do they sleep?/If they sleep,/how do we know/that they are sleeping?/

We can watch an animal and see whether its eyes are open or closed, and whether it is active or lying quietly. These are important signs, but not enough. For example, horses and cows don't close their eyes very often and fish and snakes cannot close them But [2]. A cat often sleeps with one eye open. Even humans are sometimes seen to sleep with one or both eyes open.

Animals do not always lie down/to sleep./For example, (3) elephants often sleep standing up, with their *tusks/resting/in the fork of a tree. (31) Ken came with a bag under watching animal *behavior alone/cannot answer the question/of whether animals sleep or not. (4) The answers come from (10) *experiments/by (20) a machine (30) the *telectroencephalograph (EEG). (With the EEG, scientists have found that all birds and mammals sleep. And snakes and turtles do not really sleep, but they have periods/of rest/every day./

Scientists also have discovered that chimpanzees/and cats are good sleepers, but sheep and goats are poor sleepers.
